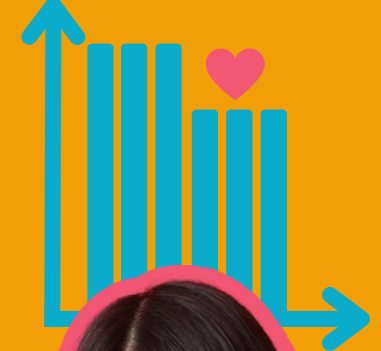

INTRODUCTION



Data is a critical tool for understanding Utah's children and their families. Data is also crucial for informing policymakers to help them make wise decisions about laws and programs that affect children and their families.

At Voices for Utah Children, we strive to provide quality data to parents and families, community service providers, fellow advocates, and Utah's lawmakers. Each year, one crucial part of this data-sharing effort at Voices for Utah Children is releasing the Utah KIDS COUNT report, Measures of Child Well-Being in Utah, a project completed in partnership with the Annie E. Casey Foundation.

This year's edition of the state KIDS COUNT provides an updated look at how Utah's children are faring. While Utah has consistently shown to be a great state for raising children, many Utah kids are still struggling, especially when it comes to education.

Utah is once again in last place for per pupil funding for education in the U.S. And more tax and spending policies are being discussed at our state capitol that could further jeopardize education funding. We cannot expect kids to thrive in the future if we do not adequately fund their education now.

Across the nation and in Utah, the COVID pandemic has affected student performance and achievement. The National Center for Education Statistics released results from their survey revealing that 78% of public schools had reported that COVID negatively impacted students' socio-emotional development during the 2021-2022 school year. National test scores dropped from 2020 to 2022, and findings indicated that students who received less in-person schooling fared worse. [1]

The data shows that poverty is an underlying factor in several of the struggles children and their families face. At Voices for Utah Children, we will continue advocating for Utah kids and utilize the KIDS COUNT project as a means of highlighting areas of concern we see.

This year's edition will include data from Utah's 11th Annual Report Intergenerational Poverty Welfare Dependency and Public Assistance Use 2022. The data looks at the percentage of children at risk of experiencing intergenerational poverty as adults.

We hope that Utah policymakers and community partners will continue to utilize the data provided by the KIDS COUNT project to help develop programs and policies that will focus Utah's precious resources on improving the lives of children.

DEMOGRAPHICS



- **Utah remains the youngest state in the U.S.**
- **29% of the state population is under the age of 18. (State population = 3,151,239)**

With such a young population, the policies we implement as a state today will help children thrive and prosper in the future. A closer look at the demographics of families helps us better understand the diverse needs families may face based on their size and the age of their children.

A family with children under five will have far different childcare needs than a family with all children over five. For that reason, in the county pages of this book, the demographic data of children is broken into two age groups: under age five and over age five.

Knowing how many children live and are educated in each county was critical to better understanding Utah's different counties.

This year, the country's race and ethnicity demographic data look at the population of children from kindergarten through the 12th-grade. The data source is the Utah State Board of Education Data and Statistics website. [3]

The Voices for Utah Children's KIDS COUNT project utilizes the American Community Survey (ACS), a comprehensive survey of a random sample of the larger population, for estimates of state demographic data.

This data helps to show trends over time by looking at how communities are changing and their changing social and economic needs. [4]

The race and ethnicity data for the county population is in a separate section, with the race and ethnicity data from the ACS 2020 five-year estimates.



ECONOMICS

Utah is fortunate that our economy has remained strong over the past several years, despite the challenges of the lingering COVID-19 pandemic and rapid growth of inflation.

Utah has continued ranking near the top in the country in terms of unemployment numbers, job creation, and economic growth.

In this book, we examine unemployment data from the Department of Workforce Services for August 2021 and 2022.

- **3.7% increase in Utah private sector employment, which equates to a 50,800-job increase. (August 2021-August 2022)**
- **2.0% state unemployment rate--one of the lowest rates in the nation with just over 35,000 Utahns unemployed. [5]**

Utah's good fortune with unemployment numbers led to excellent news for the state's revenue.

- **Utah state revenue reports over \$3.3 billion in for the 2022 fiscal year-- a combination of \$1.3 billion in surplus and \$2 billion in reserves. [6]**



With the increased revenue, the hope is that Utah policymakers understand that benefits offered to families, benefit Utah's children as well. For example, last year during the 2022 General Session, Utah passed a state earned income tax credit, which would allow Utahns to claim 15% of the federal earned income tax credit. [7] .

Policies like this are strategic tools state leaders can use to help parents who are struggling economically better provide for their children

Utah is better positioned to invest in our children than many states, and we urge our policymakers to take the lead. In a state with such a strong economy, even one child in poverty is too many.

- **Utah's poverty rate for children under 18 is at 7.5%.**
- **The intergenerational poverty (IGP) number significantly increased for children went from over 56,000 in 2020 to over 62,000 in 2021.**



In this year's edition, Voices wants to highlight this cycle of poverty and provide the percentage of Utah children at risk of experiencing IGP. [8]

The U.S. Census Bureau released a report in November of 2022 which examined the impact of the child tax credit expansion. The report credits the child tax credit of 2021 with lifting 2.9 million children out of poverty. Utah saw a two percent decrease in the poverty rate for children under 18. [9]

- In the fiscal year 2021, Utah spent \$9,095 per pupil for K-12 students per year (National U.S. average is over \$14,000 per pupil). [10]



In the fiscal year 2021, Utah's education spending per pupil was \$9,095, and Idaho's expenditures were \$9,053. A difference of \$42 is small enough to consider tied for the dubious position of spending the least per pupil in K-12 schools.

Utah's students continue to struggle with proficiency results in the categories of language arts, mathematics, and science. Utah State Board of Education recommends not comparing the 2020-2021 results due to the immense disruption to children's education by the pandemic.

In the state education page, the two school years are listed not for comparison but for reference and to understand how Utah children are doing and the work that is needed. For example, it is critical to point out that Utah students who are categorized as economically disadvantaged average 15% to 16.5% lower in their proficiency results. [11]

A key takeaway is how poverty negatively effects individuals and children's outcomes, and how policies focused on lifting families and children out of poverty can produce benefits with lasting effects.

HEALTH

Utah as a state has remained steady in terms of health indicators, although there are areas that need significant improvement. Utah is making progress in small increments.

- In 2021, the percentage of two-year-old children fully immunized increased by a third of a percent.
- Plus, parents receiving prenatal care for the first trimester increased by one percent.



Children's mental health in Utah is suffering and policies and programs to address this growing problem must be implemented. Experts have been calling attention to this growing crisis in the U.S. over the last decade. [12]

- 14%-20% of children in the U.S. are experiencing a mental, emotional, or behavioral disorder consistently. [13]
- In Utah, approximately 60% of children ages 3-17 struggling with mental health issues are not receiving mental health treatment. [14]

The purpose of the survey is to measure and assess kindergarten through twelfth-grade students' perceptions of the school environment. The survey includes answers from several stakeholders such as parents, administrators, teachers, staff, and school resource officers (SROs). [15]



SAFE COMMUNITIES

The Safe Communities data provides a look at Utah children's struggles with substance use, social and emotional health, physical health, school safety, and the environment of Utah schools. In the 2022 KIDS COUNT Data Book, Voices for Utah Children presents data from the Utah State Board of Education (USBE) 2021 Utah School Climate Survey.

The Utah State Board of Education established the 2021 Utah School Climate Survey dashboard per State rule R277-623-3. The survey period for students in their local schools was between March 17 and May 7, 2021, administered by teachers or aides in the classroom.

While this book only provides a few data points, we encourage you to review the USBE dashboard to learn more.

INTERGENERATIONAL POVERTY DATA

In Utah, whether a person is considered to be experiencing “Intergenerational Poverty” (IGP) is determined by the length of time an individual receives public assistance, first as a child and later as an adult. To be experiencing IGP is to have received public assistance for 12 months as a child and 12 months as an adult.

Some individuals enter and exit IGP throughout the year, but some receive assistance for years. Utah IGP numbers increased for adults and children significantly in 2021 primarily as a result of the Families First Coronavirus Response Act which was launched in March 2020.

The act barred states from disenrolling Medicaid participants, creating continued Medicaid eligibility, which subsequently increased the number of individuals receiving public assistance.

The number of children in Utah experiencing IGP went from 56,508 in 2020 to 62,002 in 2021, raising concerns of how many children are at risk of experiencing IGP as adults.

The chart shows the percentage of Utah children in 2021 at risk of experiencing IGP as adults. [16]

Child Dependency Ratio

A measure derived by dividing the population under 18 years by the population 18-64 and multiplying by 100. The percentage of children under 18 who are not in the labor force is dependent on the 18-64 year old population for financial needs.

The child dependency ratio is the ratio of children who are not contributing to the tax base, work force, economy, etc, and who are dependent upon those who are. A higher dependency ratio means that there will be more individuals dependent upon a strong productive work force and that work force will need to be educated and ready to fill the jobs that are available.

Households

A household includes all the people who occupy a housing unit (such as a house or apartment) as their usual place of residence. A household includes the related family members and all the unrelated people, if any, such as lodgers, foster children, wards, or employees who share the housing unit.

A person living alone in a housing unit, or a group of unrelated people sharing a housing unit such as partners or roomers, is also counted as a household. The count of households excludes group quarters. There are two major categories of households, "family" and "nonfamily." Household is a standard item in Census Bureau population tables.

Family Household

A family includes a householder and one or more people living in the same household who are related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption.

All people in a household who are related to the householder are regarded as members of his or her family.

A family household may contain people not related to the householder, but those people are not included as part of the householder's family in census tabulations. Thus, the number of family households is equal to the number of families, but family households may include more members than do families.

A household can contain only one family for purposes of census tabulations. Not all households contain families since a household may comprise a group of unrelated people or one person living alone.

Own Children

A child under 18 years old who is a son or daughter by birth, marriage (a stepchild), or adoption. For 100-percent tabulations, own children consist of all sons/daughters of householders who are under 18 years of age.



For sample data, own children consist of sons/daughters of householders who are under 18 years of age and who have never been married, therefore, numbers of own children of householders may be different in these two tabulations.

Small Area Income and Poverty Estimates (SAIPE)

Census Bureau program that prepares mathematical model-based estimates of selected characteristics of the United States, states, and school districts.

- **Prenatal Care**

Number and percent of women receiving prenatal care in the first trimester as a percent of all live births. Retrieved dates: October 26, 2021, for year group 2020 and November 8, 2022, for year group 2021.

- **Low Birth Weight Babies**

Number of infants born weighing less than 2,500 grams (about 5.5 pounds) as a percentage of all live births. Retrieved dates: November 11, 2021, for year group 2016-2020 and November 8, 2022, for group 2017-2021.

- **Infant Mortality**

An infant death is defined as the death of a live-born infant within one year of birth. Rates are per 1,000 live births. Retrieved dates: October 26, 2021, for year group 2016-2020 and November 8, 2022, for year group 2017-2021.

- **Teen Births**

Live births to married and unmarried females ages 15 to 17. Rates are per 1,000 females in that age range. Retrieved dates: November 29, 2021, for year group 2016-2020, and November 8, 2021, for year group 2017-2021.

- **Injury Deaths**

Child injury deaths occur to individuals ages 1 to 19 due to injuries (accidents, suicides, and homicides). Rates are per 100,000 youth. Retrieved date: November 15, 2021, for year group 2016-2020 and November 8, 2022, for year group 2017-2021.

- **Intentional self-harm (suicide) Deaths:**

Crude Rate, deaths per 100,000 ages 10-17. Retrieved date: November 15, 2021, for year groups 2016-2020 and November 8, 2022, for year group 2017-2021.

Immunization

This recommendation is referred to in shorthand as “4:3:1:3:3:1:4.”

- **Enrollment**

Enrollment numbers are for the Fall of each year and represent the number of students enrolled in kindergarten through 12th grade.

- **Pupil/Teacher Ratio**

Pupil/Teacher ratios are based on the total number of students enrolled in kindergarten through 12th grade. Teachers include any person assigned to the school as a "regular classroom teacher." This excludes preschool teachers and special education teachers, guidance counselors, library specialist, etc. and does not include charter schools.

- **Free and Reduced Lunch Participation**

Data is for kindergarten through 12th grade and represents the percent of the state's students who are receiving free or reduced lunches. Data is for a point in time enrollment number in October of each year.

- **Chronic Absence**

Of students with at least 45 days in membership, the percentage that were absent for at least 10% of their days in membership. This is a new definition and makes the data in this year's book not comparable to other year's data.

Results are comprised of the RISE assessment for grades 3-8 and the Utah Aspire Plus Assessment for grades 9-10.
