

Introduction

Invest in Utah kids. Seems like such a simple thing to do. And we know that we must invest in kids if we want to have a strong and healthy state. Aside from all the right reasons to invest in kids - like making sure they get enough to eat to grow healthy and strong, adequate health care to ensure their minds and bodies can mature, and families that are economically secure so that children can thrive – there is also the fact that we must invest in kids so that Utah has enough productive, capable, and educated adults to keep our economy and our population strong.

Utahns are deeply concerned about the future we leave for our children and how we can ensure that children are equipped to lead our state and our nation as they grow into adults. It's in all of our interest to make kids a state priority, and to invest in kids, the same way good parents make them a family priority.

Consider this. The dependency ratio is the population ages 0-17 and 65-plus per 100 persons ages 18-64. In other words, the percentage of people who are not contributing to the tax base, work force, economy, etc, and who are dependent upon those who are. Utah's dependency ratio was 68.5 in 2018 and was higher than the nation. This dependency ratio is projected to rise in the next 50 years, mostly due to an increase in the retirement age population. In fact, the share of the population ages 65 and older is projected to double over the next 50 years, rising from 10.2 percent of the population in 2015 to 21.3 percent in 2065.¹



This means that in the years to come, there will be more individuals dependent upon a strong productive work force and that work force will need to be educated and ready to fill the jobs that are available. To be ready for the future we need to invest in kids today. We need to make the right policy decisions today to help children in all Utah families reach their full potential. One of the best ways to make those good decisions is to make sure we have accurate, accessible data on children and their families.

The Utah KIDS COUNT Project is built around the idea that data helps us tell the story of our communities, makes us aware of problems, and brings to the forefront a discussion of the policy solutions that can make a difference in outcomes for kids. Our policy choices reflect our priorities and our priorities should be based on fact -- solid, reliable, accessible data on how kids are doing in our state. This annual publication, "Measures of Child Well-Being in Utah" is a first step in the process.

But how can collecting data help kids? Data can help policymakers and advocates identify problems that require action. Data can identify successful policies that should be continued or expanded. As resources become more



limited, data can help policymakers track whether taxpayer dollars are being effectively invested to maximize limited resources. Data also helps service providers prove the need for programs as they write grants to support Utah's children and their families. Data counts and helps us make KIDS COUNT. We hope this publication is useful as you work to ensure that our state invests in kids and creates a thriving state for the future. Terry Haven, Deputy Director









The Census Bureau's Household Pulse Survey was launched in April and has provided nearly real-time weekly data on how the unprecedented health and economic crisis of the COVID pandemic is affecting the nation. Sources and Definitions

Demographics

All demographics are from the American Community Survey 2011-2015 Estimates, U. S. Census Bureau.

Health

Source - All sources are from the Utah State Department of Health unless otherwise indicated.

Prenatal Care - Number and percent of women receiving prenatal care in the first trimester as a percent of all live births.

Low Birth Weight Babies - Number of infants born weighing less that 2,500 grams (about 5.5 pounds) as a percentage of all live births.

Infant Mortality - An infant death is defined as death of a live-born infant within one year of birth. Rates are per 1,000 live births.

Injury Deaths - Child injury deaths are those occurring to individuals ages 1 to 19 due to injuries (accidents, suicides, and homicides). Rates are per 100,000 youth.

Teen Births - Live births to married and unmarried females ages 15 to 17. Rates are per 1,000 females in that age range.

Suicide Deaths - Rate for suicide deaths is per 100,000 ages 10-17.

Uninsured Children - The number and percent of children ages 0-18 with no health coverage. Source - American Community Survey.

Immunization: By two years of age, it is recommended that all children should have received 4 doses of diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis (DTP), 3 doses of polio, 1 dose of measles-mumps-rubella (MMR), 3 doses of Hepatitis B, 3 or 4 doses of Haemophilus influenzae type B (Hib) (depending on product type received), 1 dose of Varicella vaccine and 4 PCV. This recommendation is referred to in shorthand as "4:3:1:3:3:1:4." Oral health data - National Survey of Children's Health

Economics

Poverty - The federal poverty threshold for a two parent household with two children was \$23,283 in 2012. If a family makes less than this amount they are considered "in poverty." Source - U.S. Census Small Area Income and Poverty Estimates (SAIPE).

Median Household Income - Median income divides the income distribution into two equal groups, one having incomes above the median and the other having incomes below the median. It includes all income for the entire family. Source - SAIPE.

Unemployment - Seasonally adjusted unemployment rates. Source - Utah Department of Workforce Services (DWS).

TANF & Food Stamp Cases - The number of cases (households) receiving food stamps or TANF at any time during the month indicated. A case is counted once even though there may be several individuals in the household. Source - DWS.

Intergenerational Poverty - Intergenerational poverty is defined as poverty in which two or more successive generations of a family continue in the cycle of poverty and government dependence. Intergenerational poverty does not include situational poverty which is temporary and traceable to a specific incident or time period. Source - Utah Department of Workforce Service, IGP database.

Children Under 6 With No Parent in Labor Force - The share of children under age 6 whose resident parents are not in the civilian labor force. Kids Count Data Center

Children in Low-Income Working Families - The share of own children under age 18 living in families that met two criteria: (1) the family income was less than twice the federal poverty level; (2) at least one parent worked 50 or more weeks during the previous year. Kids Count Data Center.

Education

Source - Utah State Office of Education.

Enrollment - Enrollment numbers are for the Fall of each year and represent the number of students enrolled in Kindergarten through 12th grade.

Pupil/Teacher Ratio - Pupil/Teacher ratios are based on the total number of students enrolled in Kindergarten through 12th grade and teachers include any person assigned to the school as a "regular classroom teacher." This excludes preschool teachers and special education teachers, guidance counselors, library specialist, etc. and does not include Charter schools.

Free and Reduced Lunch Participation - Data is for Kindergarten through 12th grade and represents the percent of the state's students who are receiving free or reduced lunches. Data is for a point in time enrollment number in October of each year.

Chronic Absence - Of students with at least 45 days in membership, the percentage that were absent for at least 10% of their days in membership. This is a new definition and makes the data in this year's book not comparable to other year's data.

SAGE (Student Assessment of Growth and Excellence) -The SAGE assessments are adaptive, meaning if a student answers questions correctly, the computer provides more challenging questions in order to measure the student's depth of understanding in his or her grade/course content. Similarly, the computer provides questions less challenging within the grade/course content when the student answers incorrectly.

Children 3 and 4 Not Enrolled in Preschool - The share of children ages 3 to 4 not enrolled in nursery school or preschool. "Nursery school" and "preschool" include any group or class of institution providing educational experiences for children during the years preceding kindergarten. Places where instruction is an integral part of the program are included, but private homes that primarily provide custodial care are not included. Children enrolled in programs sponsored by federal, state or local agencies to provide preschool education to young children--including Head Start programs--are considered as enrolled in nursery school or preschool. Source - Population Reference Bureau, analysis of data from the U.S. Census Bureau, 2011-13 three-year American Community Survey.

Children under age 6 whose family members read to them less than 4 days per week. Source - Kids Count Data Center

Safe Communities

Child Abuse - The number is a distinct reported victim count. Victim counts across counties may be duplicated as a victim could have been serviced in more than one county. Rates are per 1,000 population. Source - Utah Department of Human Services, DCFS.

SHARP Survey - Student Health and Risk Prevention (SHARP) Statewide Survey. The survey is administered every two years, to students in grades 6, 8, 10, and 12. Source - State of Utah Department of Human Services, Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health.

Disproportionate Minority Contact (DMC) data base - Comprehensive definitions for this indicator can be found at https://justice.utah.gov/Juvenile/ubjj_dmc.html Source - Utah Board of Juvenile Justice, Utah Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice.

Juvenile Justice Data - Arrest numbers are collected by BCI through the Uniform Crime Reporting Program. These arrests include youths who were arrested and may be sent home with their parents and or guardian. - Court Referrals, Community Placement, and Secure Care numbers are collected by Juvenile Court through CARE, - Community Placement and Secure Care numbers represent dispositions. - Certain points of contacts have a share of youths whose race-ethnicity is unknown. These youth are not included here




